## **All Madonna @ Macomb Programs Now Available Through No Worker Left Behind**

LIVONIA, Mich. — Displaced workers in Macomb County can increase their job credentials or train for a new career by earning a Madonna University degree or certificate through Michigan's *No Worker Left Behind (NWLB)* free tuition program. Offered at Macomb Community College's University Center, Madonna's academic programs in marketing, emergency management, criminal justice and hospitality management are available through NWLB.

"This is an excellent opportunity for Macomb residents to increase their employability within local industries," said Linda McIntyre, Madonna University at Macomb coordinator. "Students already pursuing an associate degree at Macomb Community College can use the funding to earn a Madonna bachelor's degree."

Governor Jennifer Granholm initiated NWLB in 2007 to help equip Michigan workers with the training and skills necessary for a competitive, knowledge-based, global economy. Those who are unemployed, have been laid off or terminated, or who have an annual family income of \$40,000 or less, can qualify for up to two years of free tuition. Through a partnership between Madonna University and Macomb Community College, students may transfer up to 90 credit hours from Macomb Community College, or other colleges and universities, to Madonna. Students complete the last 30 semester hours of classes for a Madonna bachelor's degree in marketing, emergency management, criminal justice or hospitality management at the Macomb University Center.
