Governor Jennifer Granholm initiated NWLB in 2007 to help equip Michigan workers with the training and skills necessary for a competitive, knowledge-based, global economy. Those who are unemployed, have been laid off or terminated, or who have an annual family income of \$40,000 or less, can qualify for up to two years of free tuition.
