Area Historian to Reveal “Flushed Finds” at Madonna University Library

What: Privy Historian Tony Panepucci will visit the Madonna University Library to discuss his unique archeological work — excavating old outhouses throughout Michigan. Panepucci, who recently conducted a dig at the Greenmead Historical Park in Livonia, will display a variety of found artifacts including antique bottles, china, dentures, combs, guns and toys.

“Old outhouses prove to be valuable dig sites, providing a wealth of cultural information,” said Panepucci. During a dig in Romeo, he unearthed a set of bones, later found to be 1,000-year-old Native-American bones.
